In accordance with the Rules and Procedures of the Council of Experts and the <u>Pending Monograph</u> <u>Guideline</u>, this is to provide notice that the Small Molecules 3 Expert Committee intends to revise the Dicyclomine Hydrochloride Capsules monograph.

Based on the supporting data received from a manufacturer awaiting FDA approval, the Expert Committee proposes to revise the Dicyclomine Hydrochloride Capsules monograph to add *Dissolution Test 2. Labeling* information has been incorporated to support the inclusion of *Dissolution Test 2*.

The proposed revision is contingent on FDA approval of a product that meets the proposed monograph specifications. The proposed revision will be published as a Revision Bulletin and an official date will be assigned to coincide as closely as possible with the FDA approval of the associated product.

Dicyclomine Hydrochloride Capsules

DEFINITION

Dicyclomine Hydrochloride Capsules contain NLT 93.0% and NMT 107.0% of the labeled amount of dicyclomine hydrochloride ($C_{19}H_{35}NO_2 \cdot HCI$).

IDENTIFICATION

• A.

- **Sample:** Transfer a portion of the contents of the Capsules, equivalent to 100 mg of dicyclomine hydrochloride, to a separator containing 10 mL of <u>water</u> and 1 mL of <u>hydrochloric acid</u>. Extract the aqueous acid solution with two 30-mL portions of <u>chloroform</u>, transfer the chloroform extracts to a second separator containing 20 mL of <u>water</u> and 1 mL of <u>sodium hydroxide</u> solution (1 in 10), and shake. Filter the chloroform layer through <u>anhydrous sodium sulfate</u> into a suitable container. Add 3 mL of a freshly prepared 1-in-20 solution of <u>acetyl chloride</u> in <u>anhydrous methanol</u>, prepared by cautiously adding <u>acetyl chloride</u> dropwise to <u>anhydrous methanol</u> with stirring. Evaporate under reduced pressure at room temperature until the residue has been thoroughly dried. Use the residue so obtained to prepare a potassium bromide dispersion.
- Standard: Use a similarly prepared potassium bromide dispersion of <u>USP Dicyclomine Hydrochloride RS</u>.
- **Acceptance criteria:** The IR absorption spectrum of the *Sample* exhibits maxima and minima at the same wavelengths as those of the *Standard*.

• **B.** The retention time of the major peak of the *Sample solution* corresponds to that of the *Standard solution*, as obtained in the *Assay*.

ASSAY

PROCEDURE

Buffer: Dissolve 2.72 g of <u>monobasic potassium phosphate</u> in 900 mL of <u>water</u>, adjust with 10% <u>sodium</u> <u>hydroxide</u> to a pH of 7.5 \pm 0.1, and dilute with <u>water</u> to 1000 mL.

Mobile phase: Acetonitrile and Buffer (70:30)

Diluent: Acetonitrile and water (70:30)

- **Standard solution:** 0.4 mg/mL of <u>USP Dicyclomine Hydrochloride RS</u> in *Diluent*. [Note—This solution is stable for at least 2 days.]
- Sample solution: Remove, as completely as possible, the contents of NLT 20 Capsules, and mix the contents. Transfer a portion of the powder, equivalent to 20 mg of dicyclomine hydrochloride, to a 50-mL volumetric flask, add 2.0 mL of <u>water</u>, and sonicate for at least 2 min to disperse the sample. Add 35 mL of <u>acetonitrile</u>, sonicate for at least 5 min, and shake by mechanical means for at least 30 min. Add 10 mL of <u>water</u>, allow the solution to equilibrate to room temperature, then dilute with <u>water</u> to volume. Centrifuge a portion of this solution in a 15-mL glass centrifuge tube for at least 5 min. Use the clear supernatant.

Determine the amount of dicyclomine hydrochloride ($C_{19}H_{35}NO_2 \cdot HCI$) dissolved by employing the

following method.

Buffer: Dissolve 2.72 g of <u>monobasic potassium phosphate</u> in 450 mL of <u>water</u>, adjust with 10% <u>sodium hydroxide</u> to a pH of 7.5 ± 0.1 , and dilute to 500 mL.

Mobile phase: Prepare as directed in the Assay.

Diluent: Acetonitrile and Buffer (1:1)

Standard stock solution: 20 µg/mL of USP Dicyclomine Hydrochloride RS in Medium

Standard solution: Mix 25.0 mL of Standard stock solution and 25.0 mL of Diluent.

Sample solution: Pass a portion of the solution under test through a glass microfiber filter of 0.7-µm pore size. Transfer 5.0 mL of the filtrate to a suitable flask, and add 5.0 mL of *Diluent*.

Test 2: If the product complies with this test, the labeling indicates that it meets USP *Dissolution Test* 2.

Medium: 0.1 N hydrochloric acid; 500 mL

Apparatus 1: 100 rpm

Time: 30 min

- **Solution A:** Dissolve 2.72 g of <u>monobasic potassium phosphate</u> in 900 mL of <u>water</u>, adjust with 10% (w/v) <u>sodium hydroxide</u> in <u>water</u> to a pH of 7.5, and dilute with <u>water</u> to 1000 mL.
- **Solution B:** Dissolve 2.72 g of <u>monobasic potassium phosphate</u> in 450 mL of <u>water</u>, adjust with 10% (w/v) <u>sodium hydroxide</u> in <u>water</u> to a pH of 7.5, and dilute with <u>water</u> to 500 mL.

Mobile phase: Acetonitrile and Solution A (70:30)

Diluent: Acetonitrile and Solution B (50:50)

- **Standard stock solution:** 0.02 mg/mL of <u>USP Dicyclomine Hydrochloride RS</u> in *Medium*. Sonicate to dissolve, if necessary.
- Standard solution: 0.002 mg/mL of <u>USP Dicyclomine Hydrochloride RS</u> from *Standard stock solution* in *Diluent*
- **Sample stock solution:** Pass a portion of the solution under test through a suitable filter of 0.45-µm pore size, discarding the first 3 mL of filtrate.
- **Sample solution:** Transfer 1.0 mL of *Sample stock solution* to a 10-mL volumteric flask and dilute with *Diluent* to volume.

• LIMIT OF DICYCLOMINE RELATED COMPOUND A

Buffer: Dissolve 2.72 g of <u>monobasic potassium phosphate</u> in 900 mL of <u>water</u>, adjust with <u>phosphoric</u> <u>acid</u> to a pH of 3.5, and dilute with <u>water</u> to 1000 mL.

Solution A: Acetonitrile and Buffer (55:45)

Solution B: Acetonitrile and Buffer (80:20)

Mobile phase: See Table 1.

Diluent: <u>Acetonitrile</u> and <u>water</u> (70:30)

Standard stock solution: 0.1 mg/mL of <u>USP Dicyclomine Related Compound A RS</u> in *Diluent*. Sonication may be used.

Standard solution: 4.0 µg/mL of <u>USP Dicyclomine Related Compound A RS</u> in *Diluent* from *Standard stock solution*

Sensitivity solution: 2.0 µg/mL of <u>USP Dicyclomine Related Compound A RS</u> in *Diluent* from *Standard solution*

Sample solution: Nominally 2.0 mg/mL of dicyclomine hydrochloride in *Diluent* prepared as follows. Remove, as completely as possible, the contents of NLT 20 Capsules, and mix the contents. Transfer a portion of the powder, equivalent to 200 mg of dicyclomine hydrochloride, to a 100-mL volumetric flask, add about 10 mL of <u>water</u>, and sonicate for at least 2 min to disperse the sample. Add 70 mL of <u>acetonitrile</u>, sonicate for at least 5 min, and shake by mechanical means for at least 30 min. Add 10 mL of <u>water</u>, allow the solution to equilibrate to room temperature, then dilute with <u>water</u> to volume. Centrifuge a portion of this solution, and use the supernatant.

Acceptance criteria: NMT 0.2%

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

• **PACKAGING AND STORAGE:** Preserve in well-closed containers. Store at controlled room temperature.
